Universities perform more than one-third of Canada's research. If you're thinking of research partnerships, think Canada and Canadian universities.



#### UNIVERSITIES PLAY KEY ROLE IN R&D

# \$30 billior

Overall research expenditures in Canada are about \$30 billion CAD (about R\$ 55 billion). Universities' research activities represent approximately 38 percent of that – significantly more than other OECD countries.

# **2nd largest**

The university sector is the second largest performer of research in Canada after the private sector.

# 65%

More than 65 percent of provincial funding for R&D is invested in universities.

# 90%

Most Canadian-based research in the social sciences and humanities – about 90 percent – takes place at universities.

The Canada Excellence Research Chairs is one of the prestigious programs that have attracted some of the world's best researchers to Canada's universities.

International research collaboration is widespread in Canada's universities – 45 percent of academic publications in Canada are internationally co-authored, double the world average.

Canadian universities are home to state-ofthe-art research facilities that enhance the learning experience and research outcomes of students and faculty.

Prosperous societies are innovative societies and innovation begins with basic research. Canadian universities, through international partnerships, are driving innovation throughout the economy. This is evident not only in new and improved products, goods, services and processes, but also through new approaches to marketing, organizational behaviour and business practices.

## INNOVATION THROUGH COLLABORATION

The Canada-Brazil Framework Agreement for Cooperation in Science, Technology and Innovation facilitates joint research projects, scientific conferences and workshops, exchanges and loans of equipment and materials, and student and researcher mobility.

The International Science and Technology Partnership Program provides funding for collaborative international research projects with the potential for commercial application. Between 2010 and 2015, up to \$5 million CAD (about R\$ 9 million) will be allocated to market-oriented partnerships with Brazil.

In August 2011, the President of Brazil and Prime Minister of Canada met in Brasilia and announced the development of a new bilateral Science and Technology Action Plan focused on innovation in the following priority sectors: ocean technology, life sciences, information and communication technology, and clean technology/green energy.

Canadian and Brazilian partners from academia, private industry and government are committed to working together through the action plan to accelerate the commercialization of research and development in areas of shared interest.

There are now one million undergraduate students enrolled in Canada's universities and almost 200,000 graduate students. International students represent almost nine percent of the undergraduate population and a little more than 20 percent of graduate enrollment.

Canadian universities are investing in creating partnerships with Brazilian institutions that are mutually beneficial – through student and faculty exchanges, international research collaborations and joint programs.

There are currently more than 100 active academic agreements between Canadian and Brazilian higher education institutions.

Many Canadian universities offer scholarships to Brazilian undergraduate and graduate students and look forward to hosting Brazilian participants in the Science Without Borders program.

Canada and Brazil signed an MOU on Academic Mobility and Scientific Cooperation in 2010 to encourage the exchange of researchers in support of joint research projects.

#### A PRIORITY FOR CANADA

Canada's federal government is committed to strengthening Canada's ties to the global supply of ideas, talent and technology.

Brazil is a top priority within the Government of Canada's Americas and Global Commerce Strategies, and is an essential partner for Canada.

The formation of a Canada—Brazil CEO Forum was announced in August 2011. This forum will help Canadian and Brazilian businesses strengthen bilateral trade and investment relations.

The Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada is the voice of Canada's universities, representing 95 Canadian public and private not-for-profit universities and university degree-level colleges. Its mandate includes developing cooperation between Canadian universities and institutions in other countries.
